- **Hot Dog Stand & Bake Sale:** Saturday, July 4 (Post-Parade) @ End of the Parade Route in Dunwoody Village

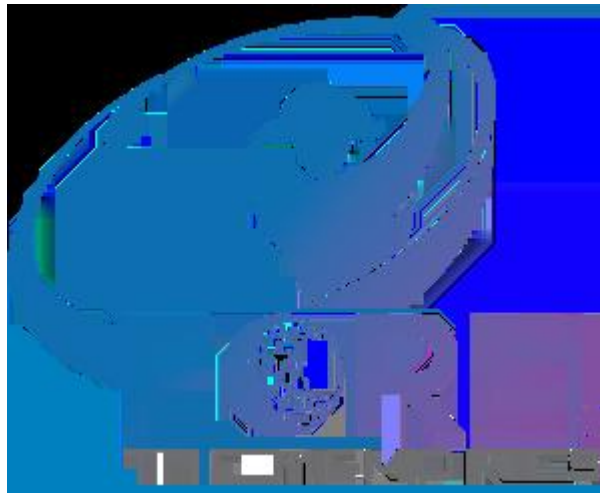
