Did You Know President Louise is an Artist?

Louise first became aware of Rotary through her father who was a Rotarian in Durham, NC and then later while working as a scientist at the Centers for Disease Care Control and Prevention where she witnessed how Rotary International worked to eradicate polio. At the CDC, Louise worked on campaigns to promote appropriate use of antibiotics and to increase the awareness of Hepatitis C.

In 2011 she decided to get involved with Rotary and reached out through RI's website and was matched up with the Rotary Club of Dunwoody. Initially, Louise struggled to become active within the club. She'd reached out to different project leaders but didn't receive direction on how to contribute. This experience has influenced her view of the importance of member onboarding and mentoring. She wants every member to become involved in

an activity so everyone has a job within the club. Louise's favorite club activities have been the Governor's Ball and preparing Tapestri's backpacks, plus all the social events.
